My dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we begin this holy season of Lent, we give thanks to God for this time of reflection and prayer when we can prepare to renew our baptismal promises and celebrate the great solemnity of Easter.

Part of our preparation involves engaging in penitential practices, namely, prayer, fasting, and works of charity. To this end, the Bishops of the United States have preserved in our dioceses the tradition of abstinence from meat on each of the Fridays of Lent, "confident that no Catholic Christian will lightly hold himself excused from this penitential practice" (National Conference of Catholic Bishops, Statement, November 18, 1966, n. 13). The law of abstinence binds those Catholics who have completed the fourteenth year of their age (can. 1252).

From time to time, certain feasts occur during the Lenten season that suggest a more festive celebration (USCCB Statement, n. 16). This year, the Memorial of Saint Patrick falls on Friday, March 17. It is well known that Saint Patrick's Day is a day of convivial celebration for many American Catholics.

I, therefore, decree that on Friday, March 17, 2023, all Catholics of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, New Mexico, no matter where they may be, and all other Catholics present in the Archdiocese on that day, are, by my authority, dispensed from the obligation (can. 87 §1). It is not required that anyone make use of this dispensation. Those who do wish to make use of it are encouraged to abstain from meat on some other day as part of their penitential practices during Lent.

Given this twenty-first day of February, two thousand twenty-three, in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, New Mexico.



Service Projects

Dig Deep! Navajo Water project. 1 in 3 Navajo still don't have a sink or a toilet. So we bring clean, hot and cold running water to families across New Mexico, Utah and Arizona. Work began with a

single family in Thoreau, NM — the Bensons — and has grown to serve more than 250 families across 9 towns in New Mexico alone. In 2018, we opened new project offices in Navajo Mountain, UT and Dilkon, AZ as we continue expanding across the Navajo Nation.

Many Navajo worry that they will never get running water. But when they hear about DigDeep, they know there is hope.

4th grade is hosting this project. More details are coming!

News for Technology class: Mrs. Hluska, our technology teacher, unfortunately had to resign to care for her family. We are working on a new technology program through our Title IV funding and we have pulled together as a team to keep the kids learning in this area. Ms. Aguirre is working with Prek-5th grades and Ms. Robbins is working with 6th -8th grade.



Financial Corner

- ➤ We are in full swing with registration. We are about 80% of our budget goal for the 2023-2024 school year.
- ➤ We are currently working on grants for the coming school year, one of which is Reading Plus; this program has been a great asset to our Language Arts program in grades 2 8th grade for the past several years.
- ➤ The budget for the 2023-2024 school year is also being developed.
- Lastly, the school is on track with the current year's budget. We will have to adjust a bit as the utilities price of natural gas and water has risen during the school year. We will adjust on the next year's budget.

➤ We are in good shape to finish the year, and begin again in the Fall.



Just a reminder that students (male and female) should not have highlights or colored hair, artificial nails, non-prescription contacts or wear make-up. Boy's hair should be cut above the collar and not have any shapes or razor art in their cuts. For both boys and girls, hair/bangs should not cover their eyes. We ask that girls keep hair items to a simple hair tie or STS uniform headband or scrunchie. No big bows or jewelry/beads in their hair. Shoes and other items for your student: please make sure that shoes should be regular sneakers that are white, black or blue; no high tops, no Vans with checks or designs, no light-ups and no wheels on the shoes. Please no boots; heels on student shoes no more than an inch. Please keep socks conservative: white, black, or blue. A small swish is fine, but no graffiti or images on the socks. Please do not have students wear the no show socks. They must be ankle or knee socks for both boys and girls. Thank you for helping in honoring the dress code for the school!
